

Chris Mottershead

The story of improving safety in the oil and gas industry



Chris Mottershead is Vice Principal (Research & Innovation) at King's College London, where he has overall accountability for research strategy and quality at the College, as well as its societal and commercial impact.

Prior to joining King's Chris worked at BP for 30 years. He joined BP Research as an engineer, supporting a wide range of businesses, including chemicals, minerals, coal, and nutrition and software consultancy. He then led a team to create and commercialise large-scale scientific computers. In the late eighties he ran BP's global exploration computing activities. Chris then moved to BP's North Sea operations, becoming the central technical manager. He returned to London, becoming the VP Technology, Engineering and HSE for BP's global gas, power and renewable activities. His final role was as the BP Group Advisor on energy security and environmental issues.

Chris is a Director of the Carbon Trust and Global Medical Excellence Cluster (GMEC) in the UK, a member of the National Center for Atmospheric Research Advisory Board in the US, and internationally is the special advisor to the G20 Commission on Climate and Energy Security.
