



Professor Michael Clarke

Managing Risk, Danger and Uncertainty: Military Perspectives on Health



Professor Michael Clarke is the Director of the Royal United Services Institute (RUSI). From 1990-2001 he was Director of the Centre for Defence Studies at King's College London, and until 2007 he was the Deputy Vice-Principal and Director of Research Development at King's, where he remains a Visiting Professor of Defence Studies.

He has been senior Specialist Advisor to the House of Commons Defence Committee since 1997, having served previously with the House of Commons Foreign Affairs Committee, and in 2004 was

appointed the UK member of the UN Secretary General's Advisory Board on Disarmament Matters. In 2009 he was appointed to the Prime Minister's National Security Forum in pursuit of the new National Security Strategy launched the previous year.

Professor Clarke is also a member of the King's PSSQ Scientific Advisory Board, and this seminar will see him apply his extensive defence experience to consider how military approaches to managing risk, danger and uncertainty might be used in the health care environment.
